



FEATURED CAR

MGA Sebring Coupe, No. 51

On September 11, 2022, the Boots and Bonnets show participants got a special treat when Jim Plowden entered his very special historic racing MGA. This MGA comes with an attitude; and her name is **LUCILLE.**



Car #51 is a very rare 1962 MGA Sebring Factory Works Racer which had raced at the Sebring 12 Hour race, among others places. She is currently owned by Jim Plowden and has been featured in several books and articles.

A LITTLE HISTORY:

From 1959 to 1962, the Abingdon factory built and prepared MGAs for racing at the 12 Hours of Sebring, America's oldest and most prestigious endurance race. A total of 11 works cars were entered over that period of time. Only one of the 11 cars failed to finish the 12-hour race, a testament to the careful preparation done by MG.

The cars featured special equipment. A special close ratio transmission and rearend, 10.75" Dunlop 4-wheel disc brakes, pin drive steel wheels, knock-off wheels, enlarged gas tank, twin Jaguar electric fuel pumps, duel coils, special air ducts, oil cooler, relocated battery, Microcell seats, adjustable rear shock absorbers, custom dash and an enlarged 21 gallon fuel tank.

At the 1962 Sebring race the MGAs had a battle of attrition going in their class. However, Parkinson and Flaherty were luckier than their rivals. Only thirty-seven of the sixty-five starting cars finished the race. Of seventeen starters in the GT1.6 group, only eight finished. But all three of the MGA team cars managed to finish the race at 4th, 5th and 6th places in their class.

For 33 plus years, Jim Plowden kept in touch with John Kelly, the owner; never failing to ask if he was ready to part with Lucille. Finally, just prior to Christmas 2012, John said he knew how much the car meant to Jim, and would like him to have her.

Jim spent the next nine months deciding what to do with the car now that he was able to buy it. In November 2013 he picked the car up in Florida. His objective was to return to Sebring for the 2014 12 Hours of Sebring event after a thirty year plus absence for both Lucile and himself.

Even though the current engine is a 1622cc, with the help of John Wright, who had an original XSP engine, Ronnie and Jim decided to create the outward appearance of the original XSP engine. They had to order custom made pistons and rods. Joe Cudo built a replicated duel 1 3/4" SU carburetor

and manifold setup to replace the existing 1½" setup. Bill Barns rebuilt the duel racing fuel pumps. White Hall rebuilt the wheel, break and clutch cylinders. Ronnie repaired and reinstalled the original transmission without disturbing the original safety wire. We used the original radiator and gas tank. Lucile was ready to go to Sebring!

The next day, Jim drove the eight mile "Race into town", hitting speeds of 100mph ignoring stop signs and red lights. What a thrill, he said!

Following the "Race into town," Lucile was honored by being inducted into the Sebring Hall of Legends. Larry Smith trailered-in Hugh Burress' #52 Sebring MGA to be united with #51 at the Sebring track. Pictures were taken with Miss Sebring and Jim attended the Gala that night at the Hall of Legends.

In October 2016, after 54 years, the three 1962 Sebring MGAs were reunited at the Historic Races at Laguna Seca, California. Although, Lucille did not race, she did give up her generator so that #52 could compete.

#51 was later put on display at the Riverside Automotive Racing Museum in Riverside, California, alongside Hugh Burress' MGA #52 and other iconic racing cars. Unfortunately the museum closed in 2017.

Lucile was then put on display at the Automotive Driving Museum in El Segundo, where she stayed until October 2018

In October 2018 Lucille was invited to the Historic races at Thermal Raceway, California. Sadly, during trials, she burned a piston and was withdrawn from the race.

That's when Jim decided Lucille was overdue for a freshening-up and an engine overhaul.

Jim swore he would never again do a frame-off restoration. However, memory fades after so many years. Thanks to his friends John Wright, Dave Nicholas and Jim Alcorn, who convinced him that owning a significant piece of racing history meant he had a responsibility to preserve her for posterity.

They decided the primary objective for the restoration was to return the car back to its original factory state and livery using as many of the car's original parts as possible. Since the Sebring cars were so unique, some parts were impossible to replace, primarily the XSP engine of which only three were ever produced. Jim chose to use the metal wings, though not original, as they were a part of the cars post 12 hour race history. His other objective was to prepare the car for vintage racing while complying with current technical safety requirements.



Jim contracted Jim Alcorn at Autovantage, the west coast MGA Mark II guru, to manage the restoration project.

Under the watchful guidance of Jim Alcorn and John Wright, the restoration proceeded.

The car was completely disassembled. The engine was rebuilt and balanced. The original transmission was converted to a short ratio for easier shifting when racing. Original gauges were restored. A rebuilt Smith chronomatic tachometer was installed. Original body and chassis parts were used whenever possible. Thanks to Hugh Burruss, owner of #52, I was able to borrow an original Microcell seat frame and seat cover which made it possible to replicate the original Microcell seats. The original wiring harness was beyond repair and had to be replicated. The reversed rim yellow wheels, which are shown in books and publication pictures, will be retained for racing, however, she now sports a set of original silver wheels for shows.

May 20, 2020 Lucille was completed. The project ended up taking seventeen months and about ninety percent over budget!

WHY LUCILE?

During a race, then owner John Kelly over revved the engine and spun the points, causing the engine to run erratic. Limping back to the pits, John made the comment "You picked a fine time to leave my Lucile" The name stuck.
