TREASURER'S REPORT - 2022

Total assets on December 31, 2022, were \$7,058. This consisted of cash of \$4,412 and regalia inventory of \$2,646. This was an increase of \$1,038 from the total assets balance on December 31, 2021, of \$6,020.

The financial activity for 2022 consisted of cash income of \$6,827 and expenditures of \$5,789. Member dues and name tag sales totaled \$4,009. Boots & Bonnets Car Show revenues were \$1,078. Other items totaled \$940.

Expenditures were Boots & Bonnets Car Show expenses of \$2,098. Regalia products sold and inventory items purchased totaled \$1,445. Website costs were \$1,364. Newsletter costs, bank and other fees and other items were \$882.




